Tense markers are special words that team up with action words and others to tell us when things happen in a sentence or story. In Samoan, tense markers also combine with adjectives and adverbs.

Subject Phrase Structure Rules

Samoan subject phrases begin with "O".

The "O" is a present tense marker that translates to:

-singular: "It is"

-plural: "they are"

A subject phrase is singular if it has singular limiters like: le, se, la'u, lo'u, lau, lou, lana, lona, sa'u, so'u, sau, sou, sana, sona, lenei, lena, lela.

Samoan adjectives describe the subject. They are stated after the main subject/noun.

The "O" is omitted when the subject comes after a verb.

Subject Phrase Examples

O se ta'avale: (it is) A car.

O ta'avale: (They're) The cars.

O le teine: (it is) The girl.

O se teine aulelei: (it is) a beautiful girl.

The "O" subject/noun tense marker is dropped when the subject phrase follows an action.
